

Te Kete Kōrero a Te Takutai Moana



Glossary

Applicant

Generally, 'applicant' is interchangeable with 'applicant group', and relates to the whānau, hapū or iwi who have made a particular application under Te Takutai Moana Act.

In the context of the High Court there is a slight difference. Takutai Moana applications made to the High Court are brought by an 'applicant' on behalf of their applicant group, and are named as such. For example 'Kōrero Takutai on behalf of Te Arawhiti'.

This naming convention sometimes results in very long application names. Incorporating these very long names into Kōrero Takutai can result in technical issues. To get around this the High Court layer in Kōrero Takutai displays the 'applicant' and 'applicant group' separately.

This allows users to **query** High Court applications by either the 'applicant' or 'applicant group'.

Applicant Group

The whānau, hapū or iwi who have made a particular application under Te Takutai Moana Act.

Application

A submission made under Te Takutai Moana Act by a group seeking to have their customary rights over a given part of the takutai moana recognised.

Application Number

Each application is given an identifying number. See **CIV Number** and **MAC Number**.

Basemap

The underlying map contained in a **GIS** programme. Data (often in the form of layers) is overlaid onto the basemap. The usual purpose of a basemap is to provide a reference point for other GIS data. As such it is normally a geographic map such as a topographic map or a satellite image..

CIV Number

The unique number given to Takutai Moana applications made to the **High Court** pathway. Each number is given the prefix 'CIV' which is followed by ten digits, like so: CIV-XXXX-XXX. The 'CIV' prefix refers to the fact that Takutai Moana applications are brought to the civil court.

Crown Engagement (pathway)

One of the two **pathways** by which applicants under Te Takutai Moana Act can seek recognition of their customary rights. Applications made to the Crown Engagement pathway are ultimately determined by the Minister Re-

Feature

An individual piece of **GIS** data, such as an application area or resource consents. Features are often grouped together in **layers**.

Georeferencing

The process by which an image or map is incorporated into a **GIS** software. Georeferencing allows for accurate digitisation of maps into GIS-compatible formats.

GIS

Geographic information system – a computer mapping programme such as Kōrero Takutai or Arc Map.

High Court (pathway) One of the two pathways by which applicants under Te Takutai Moana Act

can seek recognition of their customary rights. Applications made to the High

Court pathway are determined by a High Court Judge after a hearing is held.

Layer A collection of individual pieces of GIS data (known as features) which have

been grouped and formatted so that they can be displayed in GIS software.

This data is normally related and often from the same source.

Körero Takutai includes a number of different layers, including the applica-

tion area layers and resource consents layers.

MAC Number The unique number given to Takutai Moana applications made to the Crown

Engagement pathway. Each number is given the prefix 'MAC' followed by

seven digits, like so: MAC-XX-XXX.

Pathway One of the ways by which an application made under Te Takutai Moana Act

can be determined. The two pathways are the Crown Engagement pathway

and the High Court pathway.

Query A predefined way of searching and interrogating data In Korero Takutai.

Result Layer The **layer** that is created after running a **query**.
